Letter Naming Fluency (LNF)	Phoneme Segmentation Fluency (PSF)
<p><i>This assesses a student's ability to recognize individual letters and say their letter names. Breaking apart words helps with reading and spelling. <p><i>The key is to know each letter's sound, then blend them together as nonsense words. Oral Reading Fluency (ORF)	MAZE
<p><i>Fluency is being able to decode individual words accurately and quickly and understand the words as they are read. This is important since a child who reads with difficulty works hard at the task leaving little mental energy to help understand meaning.</i></p> <p>Open Court Decodables  myBook (from HMH reading program)</p>	<p>A screen of comprehension, MAZE is a passage where approximately every seventh word is replaced with a multiple-choice box. The box contains three words, the original word and two distractors. The student selects the correct word.
